Swimming lessons have started off very strong and very smoothly as a general rule for our Year 1 and 2 classes. We are finding that some children are having difficulty keeping track of their clothes day to day. It would be a great help if parents could keep an eye on this as the timelines when the children are going to and from lessons are very tight. Teachers do a sweep of where the children are changing to make sure that nothing is left behind. They show their classes any lost property but it is not always claimed. If your child misplaces any clothes could you come and check out the lost property at school if possible.

It has been a very interesting start to the year as far as the weather is concerned. It is swinging wildly, hot and sunny one day, cold and wet the next and a lot of very humid days in between. It has been great that hats and water bottles are being used. We are strongly encouraging all children to drink lots of water at the moment. We are finding that many are complaining of headaches and feeling unwell. We do not want to send anyone home if we can avoid it. Every single day, especially so early in the year is very important.

Attendance is a priority area for the Department of Education. Many people would be aware of the research conducted by the Telethon Institute titled 'Every Day Counts'. One of the most basic findings is that every day counts and that there is no "safe" number of days that can be missed. Not only does absences effect the current year that a child is in, it also has a cumulative effect into the future. It found that average academic achievement on NAPLAN tests declined with any absence from school and continued to decline as absence rates increased. The study found that that a child's onward attendance pattern is largely established in the first few years of school. So don't wait until Year 5 or 6 or High School before you take it seriously. Each year we review attendance data and the number of children falling below 90% is actually quite large. A quick view of the first 2 weeks of this year unfortunately shows that we are already starting to see a trend of children with low attendance. As a school and as staff we have many processes in place to support children where possible. We are also happy to work with parents as long as it fits in with the education act and other legal requirements. However we cannot do this alone. Parents have the greatest role to play and most of what you can do is very simple. Don't leave early or return late from a weekend, especially a long week end or a term break. Going on holidays during the term, although convenient to miss crowds or get cheaper prices, can effect a whole term or a whole year of learning. Only let your child stay home if they are truly unwell. If they do not want to come to school discuss it with your child and meet with their class teacher. Mr Downes has the role of tracking attendance. Over the next couple of weeks he will be contacting the parents of children who have a significant gap in their attendance, both last year and this year. Only by working together can we make sure that every day counts. At the end of this newsletter you will find a table that explains why everyday counts.

Extra-curricular activities are once again being organised by our teaching staff. These are activities that are not part of the school day or necessarily the curriculum. Teachers organise for these to occur before and after school. This is their personal time and I am very grateful that they are willing to do this. Over the next few weeks information will be sent home about the opportunities available so please keep an eye out for this. Also before agreeing to let your child participate please be aware that if they do they are expected to participate fully in every session, behave to the utmost highest standard and come every session unless there is a very good reason. There will be only one warning about effort and behaviour which will be discussed with parents. If problems continue after that the child will be removed from the activity which would be a great shame. At this stage the following activities are being organised: Garden Club (Mrs Batchelor); Drama Club (Ms Veal & Miss Boyd); Ms Motherway (Ukulele); Run Club (Mr Rodgers & Mrs Batchelor); Sporting Schools (Mr Rodgers); Code Club (Ms Ruddle & Mrs Carr); School Newspaper (Mrs Unwin & Miss Brydon); Maker Space (Mr Cavallaro); Choir (Mrs Plichta or Miss Pratley) and Chess (Mr Micevski).

Next week we will trial having the School Banking conducted in our Library. For this to operate successfully it is important that students/parents enter and exit the Library only from the Western end (the door closest to the undercover area). Children and their siblings cannot run around the library or grab books or any other resources. Hopefully the move to this area will help on those windy, cold or rainy days.

This week the P&C held their AGM. During this meeting new office bearers were elected or returned to their positions. A full list of the office bearers can be found in the P&C section of the newsletter. A significant change was the position of P&C President. Mr Troy Vukojevich has handed this role over to Mr Steve Schupp. Troy has very kindly offered to take on the Vice-President role this year to assist with the transition. I would like to personally thank Troy for his work as the P&C President. He has been a great supporter of the school and all the students and has been instrumental in many initiatives to make teaching and learning that much more enjoyable. I would also like to wish Steve all the very best in this very important role.

This week will see Mrs Trish Noack take up another position at Carine SHS. This is a promotion for Trish and is at this point in time for 6 months. This appointment is a great personal and professional opportunity for Trish and we wish her all the very best and thank her for the great work she has done at Deanmore over the last few years. While the school is conducting a selection process to fill our school officer position Kaz will join our front office team. Welcome Kaz.
