It is hard to believe that this term is only a week away from ending. It has been incredibly busy and full of many different activities and a lot of very meaningful learning. Everyone deserves their upcoming holidays and I hope that each and every person comes back relaxed and refreshed for our second term.

During Terms 2, 3 and 4 Mr Downes will not be working on Fridays. His position on that day will be filled by Mrs Morisey. Mrs Morisey filled in for Mrs Marwick last year while she was on leave. Ms Pratley will work on Fridays in Room 17 for Mrs Morisey.

From next term OSHClub will be using the demountable building in the ECE area out the front of the Pre-Primary rooms. This will be a much better area with the cold months coming. To ensure that OSH-Club can meet their duty of care requirements there can't be students/parents using that area before or after school. Not using this area at those times is a requirement that is already in place. For those families that are using the OSHClub service more details will be provided to you from Dani.

The first day of Term 2 (Monday 24th April) is a school development day and as such students are not required to attend on that day. Tuesday 25th of April is the ANZAC Day public holiday. The first day for students in Term 2 is Wednesday 26th April.

The school has been notified that we have had some students and their siblings with cases of the Foot, Hand and Mouth virus. This is a high contagious virus and students who have the symptoms are not allowed to be at school. Whenever there has been a specific case in a class we have sent a letter home to all families. If you suspect that you or your child has this virus please see your doctor and let the school know. Once your child is free of the symptoms they can return to school.

STUDENT SAFETY

It is usually at this time of term, just before holidays begin, that schools put messages into newsletters about students and families keeping safe. Of course I do hope that this is the case for the 2 weeks of the holidays. However, why this should be any different to any other day or week is a bit of a mystery. Generally most of our parents and students are very careful and responsible in their behaviour and how they travel to and from school. Unfortunately there have been many instances this term where a small minority of students and parents have been doing the wrong and/or irresponsible thing. There have been many examples of careless riding of bikes; scooters; or skateboards by students, both on the road and on paths. There continues to be many examples of dangerous driving and parking by parents at the school which is putting people, especially students, at risk.

Often parents will come and approach the school about these extremely dangerous behaviours and ask if we can do something about it. Without question we are happy to speak to students and parents when this is brought to our attention, and we do. In fact some of the behaviours in relation to driving and parking could be a police matter. Ultimately, it is each individual's responsibility to drive and park their cars correctly and legally. As Principal, I don't monitor your speed or the condition you drive in. Neither do I monitor whether you park legally, or look out for children as you park or leave the school. All of these behaviours can only be monitored by you. As Principal I do not want to be in the situation where I have to deal with a student or family member being injured or worse, due to actions that could have been avoided. Please think about your behaviour and consider all members of our school community to make every day as safe as can be.





Creating resilient kids together

Resilience is the ability to 'bounce back' from problems and setbacks. It's important for your child to learn the personal and social skills that will help them to become more resilient and cope with problems and difficult situations that may come their way.



What are the skills that develop resilience and wellbeing?

We have been learning and practising some of these personal and social skills in class. Help your child to practise these skills at home.

Self-awareness skills

Be able to identify their strengths and challenges. Be able to know what might influence their successes and mistakes.

Be able to see that the way they think about mistakes and negative situations can affect how they feel and behave.

Be able to self-reflect on their behaviour and decisions.

Be able to accept that setbacks and problems are a normal part of everyday life, and know that these situations often don't last and will improve with time and effort.

Self-management skills

Be able to manage strong feelings such as fear and anger, and turn these feelings into better ones.

Manage impulses that may present a risk to their safety and wellbeing.

Be able to make plans.

situations.

Be organised, self-disciplined and courageous to achieve their goals.

Be able to predict problems and solve problems.

Have an age-appropriate level of independence. Be able to focus on the positive things in negative

Use thinking that is grounded in fact and reality. Find something funny in a setback or problem to help keep things in perspective.

Social awareness skills

Be able to read, predict and respond empathically to others' feelings and needs.

Appreciate others' points of view.

Not exclude others because of their differences.

Know where to go to ask for help at home, at school and in the community.

Believe that relationships matter.

Social management skills

Have the skills to make and keep friends.

Be able to sort out conflict and cooperate with friends and peers.

Be able to make decisions based on safety and respect for self and others.

Be able to ask for help when required.
