

Regular attendance has many benefits that include the development of strong positive relationships between staff and students, positive relationships between peers and increased learning and achievement. For the staff at Deanmore Primary School to make the greatest difference and impact on your children we need them to be at school every day possible. It is pleasing to see that during Term 1 there has been an observable improvement in nearly all areas across the school and for that I would like to thank our parents. Since the beginning of this year we have had a strong focus on student attendance. Helping your child develop positive attendance attitudes not only helps with their schooling but also sets foundations for positive habits in adult life.

The overall Term 1 attendance rate for Compulsory year groups (Pre-Primary to Year 6) was 96.1%. Kindy attendance for Term 1 was 94.9%. These figures so far are the best the school has had since Semester 1, 2012. A breakdown for each year group is below.

What is not shown in this graph is the decrease in lateness of students at the beginning of the school day. Since the beginning of the year the number of students coming late has significantly decreased. This is not just beneficial for the individual student; it is also beneficial for the whole class. When a student enters late, especially in the earlier years, it invariably takes the teacher away from their prime role – teaching.

Making sure that the school is notified when a student is absent or is going to be absent is another focus for this year. During 2016 notifying the school of absences only occurred about 55% of the time. During Term 1 of this year this occurred 79% of the time. Although we would like to be notified 100% of the time this is a significant improvement. Below is a graph outlining notification for each year group. Our Year 2 and Year 4 parents have been brilliant at supporting the school in this area.

NAPLAN

The annual NAPLAN (National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy) will be conducted with our Year 3 and 5 students during Week 3 of this term. NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four areas (or 'domains') of

Reading Writing Language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) Numeracy

It is important to remember that NAPLAN assessments are not pass/fail tests. At the classroom and school level it is one of a number of important tools used by teachers to measure student progress and identify focus areas for teaching.

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are already learning through the school curriculum. Teachers will ensure that students are familiar with the test formats and will provide appropriate support and guidance. Excessive preparation is not useful and can lead to unnecessary anxiety. The best way that you can assist your child is to encourage them to try their best and communicate to them that these assessments are nothing more than to see how they are going as a student.

I stay in areas that are well lit

I stay in view - avoid going into areas that are hidden (such as parkland bush or behind shopping centres)

I be alert - earphones and headphones can reduce your awareness considerably

I if you have a mobile phone, have it turned on and ready to dial an emergency number

I if a passing car stops nearby, never get too close

Cyber-Safety

Children can and have used social media to bully or harass others. Here are some tips to stop cyber-bullying;

- Do not reply to rude or nasty comments.
- Immediately tell an adult if you feel uncomfortable or worried online.
- If someone is being mean or nasty on MSN block them.
- Let your parents know where you go online, just as you would in real life.
- Make sure that there are filters and other monitoring/blocking software to minimise dangers. .
- Never ever share PERSONAL INFORMATION such as your name, address, phone number or school!
- Social Networking profiles such as MySpace, Facebook and Bebo MUST BE SET TO PRIVATE.
- Passwords MUST NOT BE SHARED!!!!! Choose passwords that others can't guess.
- · Your parents should check your hotmail/msn/social networking lists..


