PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Over the weekend of June 17th and 18th our Early Childhood staff and many parents worked on a new nature play area for the Kindergarten and Pre-Primary students. This has been in planning for several months and although it looks as if it occurred over night it has actually taken a lot of planning and preparation work behind the scenes. Well done to Sarah Ruddle and Lisa Mizen who have really driven this project to ensure that it has moved from a concept to reality. Our P&C have been very supportive with monetary funds to assist in the purchasing of required material. We have also had many parents and families who have donated materials to the school to keep the costs down. A final thank you must go to all the people who donated their time to work over these two days to make this area a reality. The removal of labour costs makes such activities possible in much shorter timeframes. This is another example of how our wonderful school community works so closely with our school and staff.

Next Monday parents will receive their child's Semester 1 report. It is very important that parents read these carefully and look at the whole report, not just overall comments or grades. By reading all comments, grades and effort descriptors you will develop a full picture of how your child is progressing and the effort they are putting into their learning. By discussing these reports with your child you will also be able to help them develop an understanding of how they can further improve. Parents, it is important that a "Satisfactory" or "C" grade is the expected standard for a student in their particular year level and teaching staff have been clear as to whether they are achieving this standard or are above or below that expectation. What is also important is that all students are working as hard as they can to achieve their grades. If your child is working as hard as they can to achieve their grade, whether that is a high grade or not, that is the most important. It is important that if you have any questions about your child's report please make an appointment with your child's classroom teacher.

As parents at our last assembly heard, our school has been successful in being accepted into the Circuit Breakers program. This is a joint initiative with Western Power, SciTech and schools. By being successful in our application the school will receive two 3-D printers, other education resources and professional learning session for three staff members. As part of this program Mrs Carr will be running a special program next semester with a selection of our students. Congratulations to Mrs Carr and Ms Veal who worked to get our school's application in. It is a very exciting outcome and should be a very beneficial program for those students who are involved.

Many parents may have now heard that the Labor state government has announced that they are planning to build a new inner city high-school at Kitchener Park next to Subiaco oval. They plan for this to open to the first cohort of Year 7 students in 2020. The aim of this high-school is to address the increasing enrolments at Churchlands Senior High School, Mount Lawley Senior High School and Shenton College. To make this occur there will be a change in the local intake areas for each of these schools. This information will be provided to communities shortly. New local intake secondary School

The State Government has announced its decision to build a new local intake secondary school, Inner City College (planning name), on Kitchener Park in Subiaco.

The inner city has been identified as the best location for a new school as it is at the heart of the population growth in this area.

The new school will have world class facilities for students from Years 7 to 12 and be built for 2000 students to ease student enrolment pressures at several schools in the inner and western suburbs. Inner City College will also have a Gifted and Talented academic program.

The announcement means the local intake areas for Churchlands Senior High School, Mount Lawley Senior High School and Shenton College have been amended to create a local intake area for the new Inner City College. These will be released shortly and will come into effect from the start of 2020 when Inner City College opens with its first cohort of Year 7 students.

I would like to reassure you that if your child is enrolled at their local secondary school in 2019, they will be able to complete their schooling there. They will not have to change schools.

Additionally, if you currently live within a school's local intake area and your local intake area changes to Inner City College you will have the choice to enrol your children at your current local intake school or Inner City College.

- Food revolution day

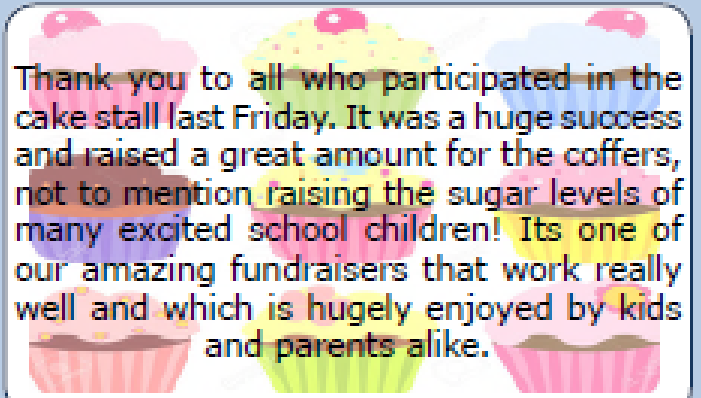
These activities have been supported by funds raised through:

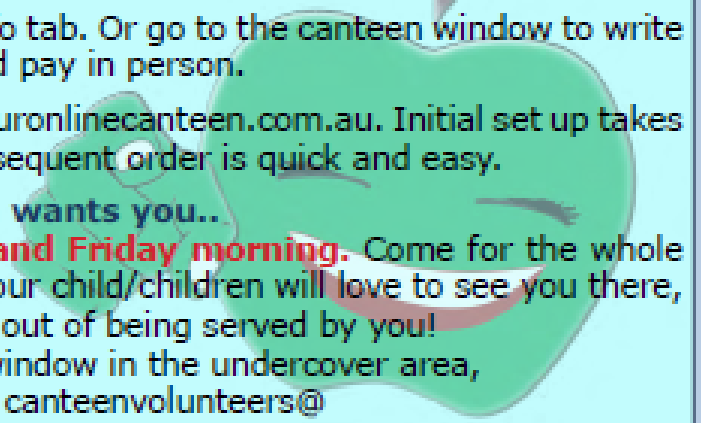
