## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

It is hard to believe that this is the last newsletter of the school year and we have less than a week to go before the Christmas holidays. This year has come and gone so fast. We started the year focusing on how we could all make a difference to our school and community and I can comfortably say that we have achieved this.

I have seen many changes and improvements across this year and I am very impressed and pleased with the work of the whole staff at Deanmore PS. This is not to say that the school hasn't faced challenges. This year, on top of all the usual work that a school does, we had our Independent Public School Review with the Department of Education Services and unfortunately an Expert Review Group review due to poor NAPLAN data for a number of years. Both of these reviews acknowledged the good work that the school and staff have done and continues to do, but also identified areas that need focused attention and improvement. The vigor that staff have attacked these issues is nothing short of admirable. In a short time we have seen the benefits of the efforts and changes that the staff have made, especially though the significant turnaround of our 2017 NAPLAN data. While there is a way to go, our start to addressing these issues has been strong and after a well-deserved break the staff will return in 2018 to meet the challenges ahead and also the high expectations and standards that we have set ourselves for the future.

At the end of this year and at the beginning of next there will be several changes to the staff working at Deanmore PS. During Term 3 the school ran a process to select some new permanent staff as there were at that time twelve fixed-term positions. In the end there were eight staff selected to fill positions permanently at the school. Five of these staff were already at the school and three are currently at other schools. Although the process was very thorough and the selection panel is very happy with the staff who were successful in gaining positions, it has meant that other staff currently at the school will not have positions here for 2018. Happily these staff members have been able to find permanent positions at others schools or positions that will lead to permanency. For the teachers this was a difficult time, as some will be leaving a school they love and for the rest of us we have to say goodbye to valued colleagues and friends. However all the staff have been very dignified and professional in the way they have carried themselves over the last four months. With that I am sure that the whole Deanmore PS community send their best wishes to all the staff who will be leaving at the end of the year and wish them the greatest success and happiness. I would personally like to thank the following staff for the work they have done at Deanmore PS as they finish their last week; Sarah Ruddle, Bec Veal, Lisa Mizen, Jess Watson, Dan Micevski, Judy Egan and Rajan Flint. I would also like to wish both Annie Motherway and Jo Marwick all the best as they will be on leave during 2018.

Last week I completed the selection process for the acting Deputy Principal position in 2018 while Jo Marwick takes further leave. The successful applicant was Mr Ralmo Dias. Mr Dias will be joining us from Dryandra PS in Mirrabooka. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Mrs Narelle Morisey for the work she has done in both 2016 and 2017 as the acting Deputy Principal while Jo Marwick has been on leave. Narelle has done a tremendous job and we are lucky that she will be remaining as a permanent teacher at Deanmore PS.

It is an opportune time to thank both the School Board and the school P&C. All the parents and staff on these school representative committees work hard to improve the opportunities for the children who are students at Deanmore PS. This year alone your P&C has provided the school with approximately \$34 800. Then with the successful running of the recent ArtMarket they raised a further \$10 600. A tremendous effort from all involved. Our School Board provides great direction and strategic advice to the school and have again been prominate in 2017, especially during the DES and ERG reviews. Both of these parent and school bodies will see long term members/parents leave at the end of this year. Their efforts and support cannot be underestimated. I would like to thank Ms Sam Maddern who will be leaving our school community. Sam has been heavily involved in the P&C and School Board for a number of years. I have enjoyed the working relationship that I have had with her and I will miss it.

## **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT**

This semester we will be sending student reports home electronically. This is the first time we have tried this method and we aim to have them delivered on the afternoon of Monday 11th December. Hopefully there will be no problems. At worst they will arrive to the email addresses provided to the school by parents on Tuesday 12th December.

This year we are trialing having the Year 6 graduation at a different time to the school book awards. As the school has got bigger it has become impossible to have these two events on the same morning and cater for the needs of all involved. ## Electronic Delivery of Reports Semester 2

This semester, Deanmore Primary School will be delivering your child's Semester 2 report electronically via email and not as a printed copy as in the past.

#### SCHOOL CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES 2018

The Western Australian Government's priority is to ensure that all students are entitled to participate in an educational program that satisfies the requirements of the Western Australian Curriculum and Assessment Outline.

The School Contributions and Charges financial procedure guides parents and carers to understand the flexibilities of school fee structures and to determine the estimated total cost of their child's education. It is a requirement of the Education Act that all possible contributions and charges are identified two months prior to the beginning of the school year.

The Deanmore Primary School Board has endorsed the schedule of contributions and charges for 2018.

#### 1. CONTRIBUTIONS

The term relates to the monies requested from parents towards the cost of materials, services and facilities used by K-6 students in the standard educational program which Deanmore PS is required to provide.

The total amount of contributions parents and carers are being asked to pay for Kindergarten to Year 6 is \$60.00.

Money collected will be used to supplement school expenditure in the areas such as materials for art and craft, design and technology and science, photocopy materials, classroom materials, web based curriculum materials/resources. While contributions are voluntary, the quality of the teaching and learning program will be maximised when each family makes its contribution.

#### 2. CHARGES

These are amounts paid for participation in separate events; sporting activities, incursions, excursions, swimming lessons, dance etc. We hope that all children will attend these activities but only those who pay will attend.

A breakdown of estimated charges for your child's participation in incursions, excursions and activities for 2018 has been included on the attached schedule. These charges reflect similar charges that have been made over previous years. Students will only incur cost when they are involved in a particular activity. The amount on the schedule represents the maximum charged for scheduled activities in 2018. You will be asked to make payment to the school for each activity as it approaches.

The charges schedule includes costs associated with:

- Specific learning activities made available to *all* students, but conditional on a payment being made eg. incursions, excursions.
- Specific learning activities made available to selected students, but conditional on payment being made, eg School of Instrumental Music program etc.
