PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

It has been a great start to the new school year and I would like to thank all our parents and families for assisting their children in making this possible. By now parents have had the opportunity to meet their child's teacher and heard how that classroom will operate during the year. It is very important that if you have any question about the running of your child's class that you speak to the teacher first.

Speaking of a great start I think we must acknowledge our wonderful student councillors and Mrs Wacker's Year 6 class on the first assembly of the year. Our councillors spoke very well especially in light of it being their first assembly and they must have been nervous. Mrs Wacker's class has set a very high standard for the running of assemblies and the items being presented. What makes their assembly even more impressive is that they only had 6 days to put it all together. Well done to all the students who either spoke or performed at the assembly; it was first rate and of the highest quality.

Before school is a very busy time for our staff and it is an important time where they are setting up and preparing for the learning that will occur during the day. Between 8:30 and 8:50 teachers make sure that your child is in class organising their equipment, handing in any notes or money and ensuring that when the siren goes at 8:50am they begin their lesson. This means that teachers are not in a position to have long conversations or discuss confidential information about your child. If you need to have such conversations please quickly let the teacher know so an appointment time can be arranged so you can have the teacher's full attention.

It is important that parents understand the school's position and duty of care requirements before and after school. Before school children are not to be playing on any equipment or running around the grounds. From 8:10am to 8:30am children are required to be seated out the front of the senior classrooms where they are supervised. If a child is waiting out the front of a classroom with their parent **they must be seated**, not running around or climbing up poles or hanging off trees. As the parent, it is your responsibility to effectively supervise your child. This includes in the Kindergarten and Pre-Primary play areas. If a child arrives at school between 8:30am and 8:50am they must enter their classroom immediately. If a child arrives after 8:50am they will be required to have a late slip from the front office before they can enter class. After school children need to make their way home or to any other care arrangements straight away. Although we do allow students to play on equipment after school it can only occur if parents are actively supervising them. This means that as a parent you must be able to see your child at all times and they must be playing in an appropriate manner. All children and parents need to be off the school grounds before the gates are locked at 3:30pm. It has been disappointing that recently Mr Dias, Mr Downes and myself have had to go and speak to children because parents are not ensuring that they are sitting quietly instead of climbing pole, trees or running around on play equipment.

School attendance is very important and will be a particular focus of the school this year. As Principal, under the Education Act 199, I am required to monitor student attendance, and if a child is away a reasonable explanation must be provided to the school by the parent. It is the responsibility of the parent to ensure that their child is enrolled and attends. Mr Downes will be working closely with our front office staff and classroom teachers to ensure that this is occurring.

At the moment the City of Stirling is conducting some considerable road works near Deanmore Primary School. As a school we do not have any control over this; however we do have concerns about what the additional traffic flow near the school means for our students. Please make sure that you speak to your child about the need to be careful on their way to and from school. Unfortunately some drivers are more concerned on getting to their destination than watching where our students are.

PARENT MEETINGS

Thank you to all the parents who attended the Parent Teacher meetings held this week. However, I believe some parents were not aware that the meetings were on.

I would like to apologize to anyone that was not notified of the opportunity to meet your child's teacher. Please make an appointment with your child's teacher to discuss your child's education in the near future if you wish.

ATTENDANCE

As mentioned by Mr Craig, regular attendance at school is very important. Outside each room is a chart titled "Every Day Counts" that outlines how much educational time your child will miss over his/her school life if they do not attend school regularly. Research has shown that if a child's attendance falls below 90% their learning decreases and their academic results are affected adversely. Arriving late at school also affects the student's learning. Late is after the siren has sounded and students must come through the office to get a "Late" slip which they give to the teacher. Students should only remain at home if they are unwell. Holidays, birthday parties, etc. should not occur during school time.

Please supply a reason for any absences by ringing or emailing Deanmore Primary School as soon as possible. The office staff will be telephoning parents of students who are absent without a reason. Mr Downes, the Deputy Principal, will be following up on any regular absences or unexplained absences. If you have any questions about attendance, please see Mr Downes or Mr Craig.

NAPLAN - NAPLAN testing for Year 3 and 5 students will occur in May. Please do not book any holidays during that time.

TERM PLANNER - The Term Planner for Terms 1 and 2 are available on the school website. It is updated regularly.

SIM - Sim lessons have begun. If you have any questions, please see me.

PEAC - PEAC lessons commence next week. If you have any questions about PEAC please see me.

SCHOOL CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES 2018

The Western Australian Government's priority is to ensure that all students are entitled to participate in an educational program that satisfies the requirements of the Western Australian Curriculum and Assessment Outline.

The School Contributions and Charges financial procedure guides parents and carers to understand the flexibilities of school fee structures and to determine the estimated total cost of their child's education. It is a requirement of the Education Act that all possible contributions and charges are identified two months prior to the beginning of the school year.

The Deanmore Primary School Board has endorsed the schedule of contributions and charges for 2018.

1. CONTRIBUTIONS

The term relates to the monies requested from parents towards the cost of materials, services and facilities used by K-6 students in the standard educational program which Deanmore PS is required to provide.

The total amount of contributions parents and carers are being asked to pay for Kindergarten to Year 6 is \$60.00.

Money collected will be used to supplement school expenditure in the areas such as materials for art and craft, design and technology and science, photocopy materials, classroom materials, web based curriculum materials/resources. While contributions are voluntary, the quality of the teaching and learning program will be maximised when each family makes its contribution.

2. CHARGES

These are amounts paid for participation in separate events; sporting activities, incursions, excursions, swimming lessons, dance etc. We hope that all children will attend these activities but only those who pay will attend.

A breakdown of estimated charges for your child's participation in incursions, excursions and activities for 2018 has been included on the attached schedule. These charges reflect similar charges that have been made over previous years. Students will only incur cost when they are involved in a particular activity. The amount on the schedule represents the maximum charged for scheduled activities in 2018. You will be asked to make payment to the school for each activity as it approaches.

The charges schedule includes costs associated with:

- Specific learning activities made available to *all* students, but conditional on a payment being made eg. incursions, excursions.
- Specific learning activities made available to selected students, but conditional on payment being made, eg School of Instrumental Music program etc.
