## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

**ERG update** – This month marks a year since we had Cheryl Parkin, Maria Cook, Barb Iffla and Taylor Webb come to Deanmore PS to interview staff, students and parents for our ERG report. It Is also an opportune time to acknowledge what the school and staff have already achieved as a school and staff at this half-way point. Below is a brief outline of what has already been achieved:

- Our school Vision, Motto, Values and Beliefs about Teaching and Learning have been developed and are being actively used in each and every classroom.
- The School Improvement Plan was developed and presented at our 6 month review (Week 4 Term 1) and was signed off by the Director General.
- Staff have identified and begun full implementation of common whole-school and whole-of-phase teaching and learning strategies.
- A smaller number of research based data tools are being used by staff to identify the needs of students and track student outcomes.
- We have begun the initial steps for the implementation of Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) across the school.
- Our ICT committee, led by Ralmo Dias and Lisa Sampey, are completing a full review of our ICT plans to improve the use in teaching and learning throughout the school.
- We saw a dramatic turn-around of the performance of our school and students on the 2017 NAPLAN assessments.

Over the next 12 months the school will be working on further embedding all of the strategies we outlined in the School Improvement Plan. We will also be putting together all the evidence to demonstrate that after the 24 month review the school will be able to continue delivering what the children of Deanmore PS deserve and require to be successful students.

There has been a tremendous amount of work required of the 2017 and 2018 staff to get to this point and the massive changes and turn-around we are already seeing. Personally I would like to acknowledge and congratulate each of our staff from this year and last who have contributed to this journey.

**Dan Rodgers** – I am sure that our school community would be aware that Dan Rodgers was in Melbourne last week as he had been nominated as a finalist for the Cricket Australia Community Ambassador Award category. Although Mr Rodgers was the runner-up on the evening it is an incredible achievement. There are 225 000 volunteers working in cricket around Australia. Twenty four people were nominated for the twelve categories that were presented on the night (two people per category). Mr Rodgers was the only teacher at the awards on the night and I would like to thank him and everyone who has contributed for their efforts and providing our children with that little bit extra.

**Senior Nature Play** – Last Tuesday night I met with the Deanmore PS P&C sub-committee who will be designing and co-ordinating with the school the building of the Senior Nature Play area. The parents who are on the committee are Matt Unwin, Aran Hart, Steve Schupp and Nirmala Stevenson. They are currently doing a lot of research and will also be seeking staff, student and parent feedback as they progress.

**Cyber Safety Parent session** – A big thank you to Steve Schupp and Lisa O'Callaghan for organising a very informative parent session on Cyber Safety. There were about 25 parents who attended the evening and they were presented with a lot of good information and practical ideas on how to manage cyber safety for their children and families.

**Dogs off leads in City of Stirling park next to school** – I have had several parents come and speak to me regarding dogs being let off leads on the City of Stirling park/oval next to the school in the afternoon. This is not an area in the school's control, however parents need to be mindful that dogs are meant to be kept on leads. It is also important that parents are mindful that there are children who are not comfortable with dogs, in particular large ones, and it can be distressing for them as they make their way home at the end of the school day.

**Students on school grounds after school** – Parents have been asked that if they remain on the school grounds between 3:00pm and 3:30pm that they are constantly watching their children. The areas that children can be in are: the swings on the oval; the 'Red and Blue'; and the junior nature playground. Unfortunately we now have parents and students all over the school and the required supervision in the correct areas is not occurring. Please make sure that you and your child are doing the right thing in the correct area or you will be asked to leave. Also be mindful that the gates are locked at 3:30pm and you need to exit the grounds before our cleaners lock them.

### WA Day - 4 June

In 1832, Governor James Stirling decided that an annual celebration was needed to unite the Western Australian colony's inhabitants, including both settlers and Aborigines and "masters and servants". He decided that the commemoration would be held on the 1<sup>st</sup> June each year (or if a Sunday, on the following Monday). The holiday was celebrated as Foundation Day up until 2011; in 2012 it was renamed Western Australia Day as part of a series of law changes recognising Aboriginal Australians as the original inhabitants of Western Australia.

### Monday is a public holiday. Students do not attend Deanmore Primary School on Monday.

Friday, 8 June is the official date for Pirate Day Friday 2018 and children, parents and staff are invited to come to school dressed in your swashbuckling best, bringing your pirate treasure (gold coin donation).

Every dollar raised through Pirate Day Friday is allocated to scientific studies focused on childhood brain cancer through The Adventurers in Western Australia and The Kids' Cancer Project in all other Australian states and territories.

In 2018, money raised by pirates in Western Australia will go to the Telethon Kids Institute Cancer Centre Brain Tumour Research Program. Funds generated by pirates in all other Australian states and territories will help fund a study lead by Dr Bryan Day at QIMR Berghofer Medical Research Institute with the objective of developing personalised medicine to treat medulloblastoma, a fast-growing, high-grade brain tumour which most commonly affects children but can affect adults too.

# KINDERGARTEN APPLICATIONS FOR 2019 DEANMORE PRIMARY SCHOOL

## Kindergarten applications for 2019 will open on Tuesday 5th June 2018.

You can obtain an Application for Enrolment form from the office or from our website. Once the form is completed it must be handed into the school office with your child's Birth Certificate (original or certified copy); your child's 'Immunisation Certificate (from Medicare); usual place of residence: for example utilities account or a lease agreement of at least three months.

Children can only be enrolled in one school for Kindergarten, either public or private.

## The closing date for Kindergarten applications is Friday 20th July 2018.

Once the application has been accepted, you will be required to complete an Enrolment Form and submit it to the school. If your Application for Enrolment is not accepted, you will be advised in writing within three weeks of the advertised closing date for applications.

Please note Enrolment in Deanmore Kindergarten does not guarantee enrolment at the school for the following compulsory year unless the child lives in the local intake area of the school.

# **School Catchment Area Education Department Guidelines**

If the number of enrolment applications exceeds the number of available places at a particular local-intake school, priority for enrolment is in the following order:

• First priority - A child residing in the local-intake area for the school, with a sibling enrolled at the same School for that year, and who lives the nearest to the school.

• Second priority - A child residing in the local-intake area for the school, who does not have a sibling Enrolled at the same school for that year, and lives the nearest to the school.

• Third priority - A child residing outside the local-intake area for the school, has a sibling enrolled at the same school for that year, and who lives the nearest to the school.

• Fourth priority - A child residing outside the local-intake area for the school, does not have a sibling Enrolled at the same school for that year, and who lives nearest to the school.

Please note: Enrolment in Deanmore Kindergarten does not guarantee enrolment at the school for the following compulsory year unless the child lives in the local intake area of the school. Compulsory years of schooling (Pre-primary to Year 7)
