PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

I would like to congratulate Miss Lisa Sampey who has recently achieved Level 3 **Classroom Teacher** status. Level 3 Classroom Teachers are exemplary teachers recognised and rewarded for their exceptional teaching practices. The process for a teacher to achieve this is very rigorous and is in 2 stages. In Stage 1 Miss Sampey was required to create a detailed work portfolio addressing the following 5 criteria:

Use innovative and/or exemplary teaching strategies or techniques. Employ consistent, exemplary practice for student assessment and reporting. Engage in a variety of self-development activities and consistently display high levels of critical self-reflection. Enhance other teachers' professional knowledge and skills. Provide high-level leadership in the school community.

For Stage 2 Miss Sampey completed a 45 minute reflective practice session which included an oral presentations and facilitated discussion with a panel. Congratulations Miss Sampey.

Faction Swimming carnival – We have recently been notified that the Churchlands SHS pool is being renovated and is well behind schedule. This has meant that even though we booked the pool in advance it is no longer available. This is unfortunately out of Churchlands SHS or our control. We are currently investigating alternative venues. If this is not possible we will unfortunately have to cancel the swimming carnival for 2018.

Requests for 2019 class placements – If you have a request for a particular class placement for your child it needs to be given to the Principal by Monday 5 November, 2018. The school only considers requests based on educational needs. Any requests that arrive after the above date will not be considered. Parents will not be notified in advance which class their child is in. It is also important that parents understand that with over 500 children at Deanmore PS it is not possible to guarantee that any or all requests will be agreed to. Schools are required to meet their set budgets as well as student-teacher ratios and this impacts on our ability to construct classes and place students. The school's class placement policy is available on our web-site for parents to read.

School Development Day Friday 2nd November – A reminder that our school development day is next Friday (2nd November) and children are not to attend school. For those families that access OSH Club services they are open for bookings for the day.

No birthday cakes and lollies at school – A reminder to parents that they are not to send in cakes, cupcakes or lollies for their child's birthday. Teachers will not hand these out and they will be sent home at the end of the day. The reasons behind this have been clearly communicated in the past.

School Board Nominations – A reminder to all parents that voting for School Board members is open. To vote please collect a voting slip from the front office. Once you have had your name crossed off your vote can then be placed into one of the blue collection boxes. Profiles of the 3 nominees can be read in this newsletter. SCHOOL NURSE

Scoliosis

Scoliosis is an abnormal sideways curvature of the spine. It can be detected by a simple examination of the back.

The normal spine has three curves – one in the neck, on in the upper back and one in the lower back. These curves can be seen from the side, but when you look from behind the spine should appear straight. If the spine has a sideways curve, this is scoliosis.

An information leaflet about Scoliosis will be distributed to all year 6 students. Please read through the information provided and check your child for scoliosis as described in the leaflet.

Colour Blindness


If you have any concerns, colour vision testing can be performed by some general practitioners, eye specialists or optometrists.
