PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Welcome back to the final term of the school year. So far it has been a very positive start to what will be a busy 10 weeks. There are numerous activities happening and the school will be regularly updating the term planner to keep parents informed as best we can.

Construction works on Jeanes Road – The City of Stirling has been notifying local residents and the school of upcoming work starting on Wednesday 17 October. These will last for about 2 weeks. I have attached the information the school has received.

New School logo – I would like to thank any parent who provided feedback on the proposed new School Logo Designs. Feedback was also from received students in Years 1 to 6 and school staff. The overwhelming favourite is below.



I would like to thank Kelly Exeter for the work she put into the designing of this new logo. Kelly took on a lot of feedback from the school community and our students.

This design will be presented to the School Board for final discussion. After this the new logo will begin to be used around school. Use on school uniforms will not be immediate as the company supplying the uniforms typically needs a 12 month lead in. There will be a gradual implementation or change to the school uniform and parents will be informed of this at a later date.

School Board nominations – I would like to thank those parents who considered this role and have put their names forward. More information about the next step in the process will be provided in the next newsletter. The nomination forms from Alison Quinn, Alex Bradley and Darren Forster are attached to this email for parents to read. Voting slips will be available from the front office from Monday 15 October. Voting will close on Thursday 1 November.

When you collect a voting slip your name will be crossed off by one of the front office staff. This is to ensure that each family only votes once. The completed voting form will then be placed into a collection box.

Parent surveys – I would like to thank all of the parents/families who completed the 2018 parent survey. There were 163 completed which is 50% of families at the school. This is a significant increase on 2016 and 2014. There is a lot of information for the school and School Board to work through; however a report will be made available at a future date on the school website.

Term 4 School Development Day – This term's school development day is Friday November 2 (Friday of Week 4). OSHClub will be open on this day for families that use the service.

Requests for 2019 class placements – If you have a request for a particular class placement for your child it needs to be given to the **Principal by Monday 5 November, 2018**. The school only considers requests based on educational needs. Please be aware that requests for specific teachers will not be considered. Any requests that arrive after the above date will not be considered. Parents will not be notified in advance which class their child is in. It is also important that parents understand that with over 500 children at Deanmore PS it is not possible to guarantee that any or all requests will be agreed to. Schools are required to meet their set budgets as well as student-teacher ratios and this impacts on our ability to construct classes and place students. The school's class placement policy is available on our web-site for parents to read.

SCHOOL CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES 2019

The Western Australian Government's priority is to ensure that all students are entitled to participate in an educational program that satisfies the requirements of the Western Australian Curriculum and Assessment Outline.

The School Contributions and Charges financial procedure guides parents and carers to understand the flexibilities of school fee structures and to determine the estimated total cost of their child's education. It is a requirement of the Education Act that all possible contributions and charges are identified two months prior to the beginning of the school year.

The Deanmore Primary School Board has endorsed the schedule of contributions and charges for 2019.

CONTRIBUTIONS

The term relates to the monies requested from parents towards the cost of materials, services and facilities used by K-6 students in the standard educational program which Deanmore PS is required to provide.

The total amount of contributions parents and carers are being asked to pay for Kindergarten to Year 6 is \$60.00.

Money collected will be used to supplement school expenditure in the areas such as materials for art and craft, design and t echnology and science, photocopy materials, classroom materials, web based curriculum materials/resources. While contributions are voluntary, the quality of the teaching and learning program will be maximised when each family makes its contribution.

CHARGES

These are amounts paid for participation in separate events; sporting activities, incursions, excursions, swimming lessons, dance etc. We hope that all children will attend these activities but only those who pay will attend.

A breakdown of estimated charges for your child's participation in incursions, excursions and activities for 2019 has been included on the attached schedule. These charges reflect similar charges that have been made over previous years. Students will only incur cost when they are involved in a particular activity. The amount on the schedule represents the maximum charged for scheduled activities in 2019. You will be asked to make payment to the school for each activity as it approaches.

The charges schedule includes costs associated with:

• Specific learning activities made available to *all* students, but conditional on a payment being made eg. incursions, excursions. Specific learning activities made available to *selected* students, but conditional on payment being made, eg School of Instrumental Music program etc.

ROAD RESURFACING - JEANES ROAD (DUKE STREET - KARRINYUP ROAD), KARRINYUP

As part of the 2018/19 Capital Works Program, the City of Stirling will be undertaking asphalt works including profiling and resealing at the above location on three consecutive Sundays (21, 28 October 2018 & 4 November 2018), aimed at extending the life of existing assets. Attached is the sketch for your reference.

The construction hours will be from 9:00 AM to 7:00 PM for approximately three Sundays only. If the works are delayed due to non-availability of the contractors or weather conditions, the City aims to start the project within one week of above given dates.

Access to your property will be maintained as much as possible, though there may be short periods when you will be requested to park nearby. If you need to leave your premises in that time frame, please ensure to have your vehicle out by 9:00 AM. Otherwise, there will be restrictions to enter and leave your property.

Road closures will be signed during the construction hours to assist the safe passage of vehicles around the work site. The City requests that you do not park your car on the road and/or the verge during the construction hours as this will delay the works.


