# PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The great start to the school year has continued and it has been very pleasing to see a very high percentage of parents attend the general "Meet the class teacher" meetings this week and last. For many classes the number of parents attending has been 90% or higher. If you were unable to attend, please contact your child's class teacher who will provide you with a document outlining what was covered.

Later this term there will be one-on-one **parent teacher meetings**. These will occur on Wednesday 10 April. The school will shut at 12:40pm and all children will need to head home or to OSHClub at that time. In the past these meetings were held in Term 3. With the School Board we looked at feedback from previous parent surveys and results indicated parent-teacher meetings are highly valued by our school community. A high percentage of parents indicated that they want these to continue but felt that Term 1 was a more suitable time than Term 3. In response to the parent surveys, we have moved the meetings to Term 1. The parent-teacher meetings are for all parent's/careers, Kindy to Year 6. For Year 4 to Year 6 classes students will also be in the meeting. With this newsletter is a note that requests parents to indicate a time block when they can attend a meeting. Please fill this note in and return it by Friday 15 March.

Late last year, Hon Sue Ellery Minister for Education and Training, released a 10 point plan to address **School Violence**. All staff at Deanmore PS have had the opportunity to go through this plan and what it means for our school behaviour management processes. This week I discussed the document with the School Board. As an organisation we know and understand that acts of violence within schools is very small and rarely occurs at Deanmore PS, however it is a serious issue that needs to be addressed by the whole community. The 10 Actions are very strongly worded and reflect the seriousness that the Government and the Department of Education places on this issue. For parents it is important to note that although there are actions Principals are required to follow, there are also processes that govern those actions and must be followed. It is important that parents take the time to read this document and it can be found on our website under the parent information section.

One new initiative that Deanmore P.S. has put in place this year is 'Team Deanmore'; **our new approach to behaviour management**. Many parents by now would have heard their child talk about Start and Stop behaviours; Tokens; Dojo points; Behaviour Matrix; Team Deanmore assemblies; and 1, 2, 3 Take A Break. Over the second half of 2018 the staff worked very hard in preparing our new positive approach to behaviour management. From day one of this year we have begun a soft launch. As it is new, and needs to be tailored for individual schools, we accept that we will have adaptions to our Behaviour Matrix and processes. While this is occurring, staff are explicitly teaching children our school values and the appropriate 'Start' and 'Stop' behaviours from Kindy to Year. 6. At the beginning of Term 3 the school will conduct a community launch and parents will be invited to attend. In the meantime, parents can support their child by asking why they received a token and the school value they showed. It is important that parents understand that Dojo points are not a competition; they are a way for the school to collect data on the values the children are displaying, and the number of positive interactions shown in the classroom and playground.

This week I reviewed the school's **Dress Code Policy** with the school board, and it will come into effect straight away. There are very few adjustments to what is already commonly understood about our dress code policy. The main changes are as follows:

- Children are expected to wear broad-brimmed or bucket hats from Kindy to Year 6. Many children already have these and are wearing them. For Year 6 children I would not expect parents to rush out and buy a school hat. Year 6 children for 2019 can wear non-school versions if they are not offensive or have any inappropriate logos.
- When participating in Phys-ed or sporting events proper runner/joggers/sneakers are to be worn.

This term I am putting together the school's response to the **2017 Expert Review Group visit** and findings. Over the last 18 months the school has been addressing the findings and implementing our school improvement plan. If all goes as expected I should hear during Term 2 whether the school has met all the findings and can move forward from the ERG report.

Currently some staff have expressed interest in accessing the use of a **School Therapy Dog**. Although not yet wide spread, the use of these types of animals are becoming more common. Therapy Dogs have proven to be very beneficial for students with additional needs such as anxiety, social and emotional difficulties and special needs. I am sure that people would understand that to make this happen there are several issues that must be addressed. The first and most significant issue is to identify if we have any child that have been identified as being allergic to dogs. If your child is allergic to dogs please let me know as soon as you can so I can discuss the process with you personally.
