Dear Parents/Guardians of Year 5/6 students

I would like to invite you, as a parent of a Year 5 or 6 student at a school in our enrolment zone, to visit Churchlands SHS on the morning of **Friday 8 March 2019**.

This visit will provide a “warts and all” opportunity to view our school’s facilities and the teaching and learning process during the morning.

The Principal, Mr Hunt, will make a brief presentation to you on the school’s educational vision and values together with important processes and policies. 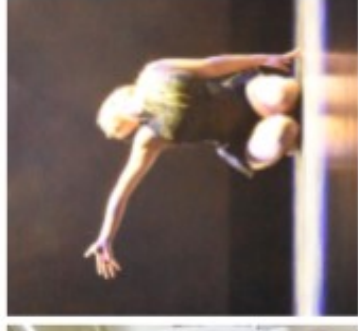
