PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Welcome back

It is wonderful to see all children return with great enthusiasm from the first term school holidays. From the many conversations I have had, many families had a great break and some fabulous adventures. We have also had several new families and their children arrive at Deanmore PS this term and I wish them all the very best as part of our community of learners.

Welcome Miss Emma Williams

This term Miss Emma Williams has joined our staff as the teacher in M4 for the rest of 2019; replacing Mrs Victoria Unwin who has had to return to England. I would like to welcome Miss Williams to our school and community.

Our four School Values are Respect, Responsibility, Unity and Excellence and generally, as a school community, these values are adhered to. Unfortunately, from time to time there are some community members who do not support the school in ensuring that these are followed. As a school we regularly remind or speak to parents about caring and respecting our school site, staff and facilities. On returning to Term 2 several issues have arisen and these are outlined below.

Students on site before and after school

Classrooms do not open until 8:30am with formal teaching beginning at 8:50am. Unless your child has an organised activity they should not be at school before 8:30am. School staff do not have to supervise children before 8:30am. Sometimes it is unavoidable that parents need to drop their children off before 8:30am. If this does occur, they are required to come to the area in front of the Doolum teaching block where one of the school leaders (Principal or Deputy Principal) will supervise them. Children are not to be out the front of their classroom or playing on any equipment. It is not the school's or a school leader's role to supervise children before official opening times.

All children must leave at 3pm and teachers are not required to supervise children for more than 5 or 10 minutes after the school bell. Children are required to head straight home or to alternative arrangements. They are not permitted to play in particular sections of the school or on certain equipment. The school has chosen to leave the gates open until 3:30pm and allow families to use the 'Red and Blue' play equipment (near the double gates that lead out to Ranier St) and 'Junior Naturescape' (between Man-Yin-Ee and Kwilena teaching blocks). Children must be supervised by a parent/carer when using these areas. All families need to leave the grounds before the gates are locked at 3:30pm. The front office is not an exit for parents because they have not exited the grounds on time. The School has a 'Before and After School Care' provider on site that parents can access (OSHClub).

Dogs on site

Please remember that dogs are to remain off the school site at all times. Please do not chain/tie them at gates where children need to enter or leave the school. Please do not carry your dogs on to the school site either.

New garden

Over the holidays we had a new native garden created in front of the Man-Yin-Ee demountable. Our gardeners did a lot of work to plan and prepare for this and had to budget for it over a period of time. It is a great addition to the school grounds, and I would like to thank Graeme, Greg and Keith for the work they did to make this happen. Unfortunately, within the first 2 days we have had to ask students to not run through the garden or break the leaves off the grass tress. This has been occurring in front of parents who are not taking responsibility for their children and not stopping them from damaging the garden. Please ensure that as a community you respect the work our gardeners have done and make sure that your children enjoy looking at the garden but do not allow them to damage it.

Our students know the behaviours that are expected of them, and regularly demonstrate them during the school day. It is disappointing to watch children misuse and/or damage school facilities (e.g. climbing on statues, playing in the toilets) and gardens after school hours. When on the school site, whether that is during school times or with their parents, they need to follow the behaviours that are expected of them and this includes when they are in the care od a parent. As a parent you have the responsibility to support your child in following our values and expected behaviours. Please don't confuse them, or set them up to be in trouble, by ignoring simple rules, values and expectations.

This year children in Year 3 and 5 will be doing their NAPLAN assessments On-line for the first time. Staff have done preparation work with children to make sure they are ready for the technical aspects of the assessments. The only assessment that won't be done on-line in 2019 is the Year 3 Writing. The assessments will be conducted between May 14 and 24.

The assessments must run in a predetermined order; Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language, Numeracy. It is important that you notify the school immediately if your child is away during the testing window so catch-up sessions can be organised.

KINDERGARTEN APPLICATIONS FOR 2020 DEANMORE PRIMARY SCHOOL

Kindergarten applications for 2020 will open on Monday 13th May 2019.

You can obtain an Application for Enrolment form from the office or our website. Once the form is completed it must be handed into the school office with your child's Birth Certificate (original or certified copy); Immunisation Certificate (from Medicare); Proof of residence: for example utilities account or a lease agreement of at least three months.

Children can only be enrolled in one school for Kindergarten, either public or private.

Once the application has been accepted, you will be required to complete an Enrolment Form and submit it to the school. If your Application for Enrolment is not accepted, you will be advised in writing within three weeks of the advertised closing date for applications.

Please note Enrolment in Deanmore Kindergarten does not guarantee enrolment at the school for the following compulsory year unless the child lives in the local intake area of the school.

School Catchment Area Education Department Guidelines

If the number of enrolment applications exceeds the number of available places at a particular local-intake school, priority for enrolment is in the following order:

- First priority A child residing in the local-intake area for the school, with a sibling enrolled at the same School for that year, and who lives the nearest to the school.
- Second priority A child residing in the local-intake area for the school, who does not have a sibling Enrolled at the same school for that year, and lives the nearest to the school.
- Third priority A child residing outside the local-intake area for the school, has a sibling enrolled at the same school for that year, and who lives the nearest to the school.
- Fourth priority A child residing outside the local-intake area for the school, does not have a sibling Enrolled at the same school for that year, and who lives nearest to the school.

Please note: Enrolment in Deanmore Kindergarten does not guarantee enrolment at the school for the following compulsory year unless the child lives in the local intake area of the school.
