PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Year 3 and 5 children across the country participated in **NAPLAN** assessments throughout the week. These assessments cover Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language, and Numeracy. This year is the first time that Deanmore PS has completed NAPLAN on-line (except for Year 3 Writing) and all schools will be required to do this in 2020. There are significant benefits to completing these assessments on -line including; a greater range of available questions; questions change during a test to reflect the child's previous answer which will provide more specific information; results of assessments should be returned much quicker (hopefully before the end of Term 2) for school use.

As with many schools across Australia, and in particular throughout Western Australia, we did encounter issues. Some were quickly and easily overcome, while others were not. At this stage it is difficult to ascertain the affect on assessments if any. All the children should be congratulated for the attitude they showed throughout the assessments. All we asked was that they did their very best and didn't give up.

It has been a couple of busy weeks for our P&C. They have run the Mothers' Day stall and will be raising funds during the Federal election this weekend. A big thanks to our P&C and all those parents who supported these initiatives that raise funds for children at Deanmore PS.

This week our Year 6 classes will be participating in the first Eagles Cup competition against other schools in our local area. What is most important is how they carry themselves and respond to winning or losing. Being a good sport and accepting the result is most important and I have no doubt they will display our school values. Good luck Team Deanmore.

I would like to thank all parents who read last fortnights newsletter and took on-board the need to support children following school rules and values outside of hours. This fortnight it has been obvious that children have been playing in correct areas and treating the school grounds and equipment with respect. By working together, we will send to all children a clear and consistent message.
