School Overview



Staff Responses 15 responses were collected from staff. This is approximately 25% of staff. 93% of these held a teaching role. Staff were asked a series of questions in relation to the school and its operations. Rating the highest were the following responses: Teachers at this school expect students to do their best. Teachers at this school provide students with useful feedback. Students at this school can talk to their teachers about their concerns. The lowest rating item was 'the school takes staff opinions seriously', rating 3.9 out of a possible score of five. Two staff members disagreed with the statement, with 74% of staff agreeing.
